

Snippets from Overseas

The Grand Lodge of Russia

Grand Lodge of Russia held its Communication in Perm on 9th June 2018. The event celebrated 235 years of Freemasonry in the Russian Urals and in Perm and featured the Grand Master's Welcome Dinner, the Annual Communication, and a concert and theatrical performance. Freemasonry took root in Russia in 1731. After decades of suppression in the Soviet era the Grand Lodge was founded in 1995. The Communication realistically celebrated 235 years since Freemasonry was made its first appearance in Perm.

The Grand Orient of Italy

The Grand Master of the Grand Orient of Italy, earlier this year, circulated a letter of appeal for support to all Masonic Grand Lodges throughout the world. He reports that the Italian Parliamentary Commission on Criminal Organisation has ordered the Grand Orient to provide lists of brethren affiliated with lodges in two Italian regions. He is fighting what he describes is an 'unlawful and illegitimate' use of power and is resolute in filing an appeal with the European Court of Human Right if necessary. The Grand Master is asking all 'in the Chain of Union' to proclaim our values and re-affirm our work for the improvement of humanity in the face of 'populism and dangerous anti-democratic involutions'.

The Grand Lodge of Albania

The Grand Chancellor for the United Grand Lodge of England has written to advise that, in 2014, the Grand Lodge of Albania consecrated a lodge in Kosovo, an action regarded by other Grand Lodges in the area as unwarranted and an invasion of territory within the masonic sphere of the Regular Grand Lodge of Serbia. As a consequence, the Board of General Purposes of the United Grand Lodge of England considered that it would be in the best interests of the Grand Lodge to suspend relations with the Grand Lodge of Albania while further enquiries were made into the situation. Kosovo is a partially recognised state and disputed territory Southeastern that declared Europe 2008 independence from Serbia in February the Republic of Kosovo.

Grand Master of the United Grand Lodge of England, (HRH the Duke of Kent KG, CGMG. GCVO, ADC) acknowledging the gift presented by our Grand Master, M.W. Bro. John Slore on behalf of the Masons of Tasmania at the UGL of England Tercentenary Celebrations.

The gift, in the form of the golden ratio or phi, forms a perfect ashlar, it is constructed from unique Tasmanian timbers and has a Tasmanian masonic penny set into it.

It was very kind of you to make a presentation. The medal set in wooden block made from different trees from Tasmania with presentation inscription is currently on display in a special exhibition in our Museum and will be incorporated into our permanent collections. R.W. Bro. Cameron raises a toast to the haggis


and has proved to be highly successful, predominantly because of Brian's background as a teacher and indeed his expertise in the selection of recipients.



60 Year Jewel Presentation in Burnie Masonic Lodge R.W. Bro. James Moran Cameron

R.W. Bro. James Moran Cameron, the Bard of Craigielea in the Clydeside town of Paisley, in Scotland, completed his National Service as a member of the Royal Air Force Regiment, in a sunny and rather inhospitable Egypt.

He returned home to Scotland and was introduced into Lodge Craigielea No. 1218 in the Scottish Constitution in 1958.

He uprooted himself and first graced the Tasmanian scene in 1962. Retaining the membership of his mother lodge in Scotland, he affiliated with the former Gill Memorial Lodge in Burnie in 1978.

His introduction, within one week of his arrival, to one who was to become his best friend and the presenter of his 60 Year Jewel, on behalf of the Grand Master, was R.W. Bro. John Windram.

James elevated from Initiate to Master Mason in a mere two months and as such commenced a very active Masonic Career in Tasmania with the former Gill Memorial Lodge in 1978 and as a founder member of Burnie Masonic Lodge at the amalgamation in 1992, becoming Worshipful Master of the Lodge, for the first time in 1993 and again in 2005.

R.W. Bro. Cameron has an ongoing involvement with the Grand Lodge North West Ceremonial Team and was conferred with the rank of Past Grand Warden in 2016.

A great exponent of the round ball game, he played regularly for Burnie Rovers and the North West Tasmanian Soccer team and with the termination of his playing days took up refereeing.

A strong supporter of Ex Service organisations, he is a Past President and a Life Member of Wynyard R.S.L. and a Past President of Parklands High School Parents and Friends. A great exponent of the works of Robbie Burns and Life Member of Burnie Burns Club.

In Freemasonry we are taught to practice outside the Lodge those things learnt within and R.W. Bro. James Moran Cameron is an excellent example of this concept.

A Relic of Freemasonry in China

When visiting New Zealand recently, I was given a and the British Masonic Hall in Beijing Road West then handsome enamelled jewel, probably a Past Master's jewel without suspension and ribbon, for Cosmopolitan Lodge No 428. The jewel was amongst masonic material that had been collected by my good friend and masonic mentor, Mervyn Hynes – a Sovereign Grand Inspector General in the AASR (Scottish Constitution). My assumption was that the jewel was from a New Zealand Indeed, the English District lodge and I was pleased to have it because it is such a fine piece of enamel work. "Mr Google" soon put paid to that assumption however, and I learnt that Cosmopolitan Lodge No. 428 was a Scottish Constitution lodge working in Shanghai, China.

The lodge was consecrated in Shanghai on 28 December 1864. It is interesting to note that the officers of the lodge at the consecration were invested by Bro. R. F. Gould, later P.S.G.W. (English Constitution), the noted masonic historian. Gould was at that time domiciled in China. The lodge flourished for almost a century until 1961 when it's active membership had reduced to five and its continuing operation was no longer viable. In February 1962, the Master wrote to the Grand Secretary indicating that he was the sole remaining member and suggested that the lodge remain dormant for a time leaving the open the possibility of 'resuming activities in another land'. This was put into effect in August 1962 and the lodge later resumed working in Hong Kong.

With the demise of the lodge, Freemasonry no longer had a presence in Shanghai and, indeed, in mainland China,

became the Shanghai headquarters of the Five Chinese Medical Associations. It is interesting to note that the demise of Freemasonry after thirteen years of Communist rule had not come about because of pressure from the

government but, rather, from attrition of membership. Grand Master of Northern China had offered to close if the Central Peoples' Government had requested it, affirming that regular Freemasons always gave obedience to the lawful government of whichever country they were in. request was made and the British lodges meeting in the Masonic Hall in Beijing Road West in Shanghai continued to meet without difficulty.

Unique and Memorable Masonic Ceremony - At Lodge Dorset, No. 17, Scottsdale (Tasmania) - 1947

As related by V. Wor. Bro Dale Orchard

I recently had the good fortune to receive a lodge case that had been put away unopened for some sixty or more years.

This case had belonged to Bro. Les Lethborg, a member of Dorset Lodge, who had died about 1960. Although his son and grandson had been members of Dorset I doubt his family knew about the Lodge case, as it had been put away untouched, and only came to light when his daughter-in-law moved house, found it and handed it on to me

When I joined Dorset Lodge the Biggs family photo was just hanging on the wall, but other than a few members talking about them occupying all offices there was never any mention about a story behind it.

The Lodge case contained the full story behind the Biggs family photo which no one seemed to know existed, a notice paper for that night's meeting, plus a very battered Bible part prayer book which Les had carried through the First World War. The description of the ceremony had been compiled by W. Bro. A. E. Osborne, secretary.

Dorset Lodge meets on the third Saturday of the month, but on this occasion an emergency meeting was held on the 1st Saturday, 4th January 1947, as the members of the Biggs family were in Scottsdale to celebrate the diamond wedding of the oldest Past Master of the Lodge.

The story of the ceremony was presented to the lodge at its January meeting, 71 years later.

(Extract of Minutes of an Emergency Meeting compiled in 1947, by W. Bro. A. E. Osborne, P.M., Secretary .)

A unique and memorable Masonic gathering, associated with the Diamond Wedding Celebrations of the oldest Past Master of the Lodge was held at Scottsdale on Saturday, January 4, 1947, when Wor. Bro. A. W. Biggs and his six Masonic sons occupied all the offices for the ceremony of Raising, the candidate being Bro. Rev. Harold G. Biggs, of the third generation of the Biggs' family.

The function took place in the Mechanics' Hall, as the Temple would not have been large enough to accommodate the large number attending.

The building had been specially prepared for the occasion by bringing all the furniture from the Temple, by the erection and carpeting of a dais, and by laying carpets for the full length of the Hall.

LODGE OPENED -The Lodge was opened at 7 p.m., the chair of King Solomon being occupied by the Wor. Master (Wor. Bro. L. J. Waldon).

VISITORS - After opening the Lodge, considerable time was occupied in receiving visitors, who came from all parts of the State. There was a stir of interest when Wor. Bro. A. W. Biggs and his six sons were announced, and after saluting at the base, took up their respective seats. The receiving of visitors occupied three-quarters of an hour.

The Acting Wor. Master than asked his sons to take up their respective positions in the Lodge as follows:

Acting W.M. - Wor. Bro. A. W. Biggs (Scottsdale)

S.W. - Wor. Bro. Alfred E. Biggs (Longford)

J.W. - Bro. Oscar H. Biggs (Hobart)

Chaplain - Bro. Fred. H. Biggs (Sydney)

S-D. - Bro. Chas. C. Biggs (Melbourne)

J.D. - Bro. Len. W. Biggs (West Australia)

I.G. - Bro. Reg. A. Biggs (West Australia)

The candidate was Bro. Rev. Harold Guy Biggs, of Flinders Island, a grandson of the Acting W.M.

CONGRATULATIONS - The Acting Wor. Master, descending from the dais, shook hands with his grandson, and earnestly congratulated him on having attained his majority in Freemasonry

The substituted secrets were then imparted by the Wardens and received by the Acting Wor. Master from the Senior Warden.

GAVEL RETURNED - Lodge was closed in the Third Degree. The Acting Wor. Master returned the gavel and expressed his thanks for the great privilege bestowed upon himself and his sons in being permitted to conduct the ceremony.

CONGRATULATIONS - In accepting the gavel, the Wor. Master congratulated Wor. Bro. Biggs and his family on their very fine work.

COMMENTS BY GRAND MASTER - The Most Wor. Grand Master said that the Brethren who had come to Scottsdale to join with Dorset Brethren in this important ceremony must feel very pleased indeed that they had attended. This gathering was quite unique in the history of Freemasonry; it had never occurred in Tasmania before, and perhaps not in any part of the world. He referred to the fact that Wor. Bro. Biggs and his wife were celebrating their Diamond Wedding, and it was that circumstance which brought about the meeting being held that night. The Most Wor. Grand Master then commented on the fine Masonic work of Wor. Bro. Biggs, and said they desired to confer upon him the rank of Past Grand Deacon of the Grand Lodge of Tasmania.

INVESTED - Wor. Bro. Biggs was then invested by the Most Wor. Grand Master, to the accompaniment of applause.

Wor. Bro. Biggs said he felt overwhelmed by the kind words of the Grand Master, and particularly by the great honour conferred upon him.

Grand Lodge Officers retired, and the Lodge was closed in the usual form, the closing hymn being "Abide with Me."

The Director of Ceremonies was Wor. Bro. H. G. Salier, who has been associated with Wor. Bro. Biggs masonically for nearly 40 years, and the organist was Bro. H. J. C. Engisch.

At the conclusion of the ceremony, Wor. Bro. Biggs and his sons were overwhelmed with congratulations.

Historic Event Celebrated

The unique and historic event was celebrated at the customary "fourth," which on this occasion took place in

the large refreshment room under the grandstand building on the recreation ground. Between 160 and 170 brethren were present. The supper tables had been nicely arranged and decorated.

Wor. Bro. J. J. Waldron presided. On his right sat the Most Wor. Grand Master (Wor. Bro. H. V. Biggins), and on his left the honoured guest of the evening - Wor. Bro. A. W. Biggs. Seated immediately in front at a round table were the six sons and the newly-raised grandson. A special toast list had been arranged for the occasion.

The toast of Grand Lodge was proposed by Wor. Bro. J. J. Waldron.

In replying, the Most Wor. Grand Master said it was a memorable occasion, and none of them would ever forget that night. It was a gathering in honour of their old friend - Wor. Bro. A. W. Biggs. The members had shown very heartily their appreciation of an old and valued member, and he congratulated Wor. Bro. Biggs and his sons for doing the work so well in the Temple. He also expressed the sincere congratulations of all the brethren present on the occasion that brought the family together.

The toast of Wor. Bro. A. W. Biggs and family was proposed by Wor. Bro. H. G. Salier, who said that never before in the history of Freemasonry in Tasmania - or perhaps in the world - had such a memorable gathering taken place, and all rejoiced to be celebrate such an occasion. He remarked that he had contacted Wor. Bro. Claude James in London, telling him of the great event that was being arranged, and Wor. Bro. James in a reply had stated he had announced the details at three Lodges he had visited. and the interest and consternation caused had been remarkable. Lodge Dorset had recently conferred a Life Membership on Wor. Bro. A. W. Biggs to commemorate the occasion. The sons were an example of what family life should be, and the celebration of a diamond wedding was the reward of a life well spent. He wished Wor. Bro. Biggs many years of continued happiness in the Lodge and congratulated him and his six sons on the splendid manner in which they had carried out the degree work.

CAKE FOR THE OCCASION - At this stage a large decorated cake, suitably inscribed tor the occasion, was brought in, the brethren rising and singing "Happy Birthday" and "Jolly Good Fellows." The cake was made and given by Bro. W. G. Guy.

REPLY BY WOR. BRO. BIGGS – Wor. Bro. Biggs was most heartily received on rising to respond. He felt positively snowed under with the honours conferred upon him, and the utmost gratitude for all that had been done. He was warmly appreciative of all the work done in preparing for this night and expressed his thanks for the numerous letters and telegrams of congratulation. "Above all," he concluded, "I thank the Great Architect of the Universe for 60 years of good health and married bliss, and for the blessings of my family, whom I claim to be good citizens." He said they were a united and affectionate family, and that was a source of great gratitude.

Wor. Bro. Rev. Alf. Biggs also replied, endorsing the sentiments expressed by his father, and stating that the thorough way the function had been carried out was typical of Dorset Lodge.

The toast of "Our Newly-Raised Brother" was proposed by Wor. Bro. H. E. Spotswood, who remarked that Bro. Rev. Harold Biggs was one of the finest candidates ever raised in Dorset, and at the conclusion said: "If you follow your grand-dad you will be alright"

Bro. Rev. Harold Biggs said it was a privilege to him to be a candidate that night, and the ceremony had impressed him tremendously. He would do all in his power to live up to the standard or his grandfather and his family.

"OUR VISITORS" toast was proposed by Bro. Oscar Biggs, who deemed it a high honour and a great privilege to do so when he was actually a visitor himself. It was a special joy to welcome so many on this occasion.

Wor. Bro. Jim Parsons, of Mersey Lodge, replied on behalf of all visitors.

Wor. Bro. Biggs thanked the ladies and the members of Lodge Dorset for preparing the banqueting room.

After the Tyler's Toast, the brethren sang "Auld Lang Syne," followed by the National Anthem. Three rousing cheers for the Biggs' family concluded a most remarkable and memorable gathering.
