

The Supreme Council of the AASR Appoints New District Commander for Bass

The Supreme Council of the Ancient and Accepted Scottish Rite for Australia has appointed V. III. Bro Ray Chell as District Commander for Bass.

"Ray is an excellent choice for the position" said M. III. Bro Bill Morgan, Regional Commander for Tasmania. "He is a well-respected Freemason in Tasmania and has served the Rite with distinction as District Recorder for the last fourteen years and as a former Sovereign of Ernest Clark Sovereign Chapter and Grand Commander of the Northern Tasmania Sovereign Council".

V. III. Bro Chell assumed his new position on 1 July 2013 following the retirement of V. III. Bro. Greg Parkinson. V. III. Bro Parkinson, who was previously District Commander for Tasmania, and later District Commander for Bass (Northern Tasmania) when Tasmania was created a Region of the AASR in its own right, completed his five-year term of office on 30 June.

V. III. Bro Chell was elevated to the 33rd degree in Sydney on 20 June during Supreme Council Week when all Sovereign Grand Inspectors' General are summoned to an annual convocation. He will be formally installed as District Commander at a ceremony to be held at the Masonic Centre in Launceston on Saturday 17 August in conjunction with a meeting of the Ernest Clark Sovereign Chapter.

Masonic Education

During the past few months, your Masonic Education Team has been putting in place our plans for the future direction of Masonic Education in Tasmania.

This has been greatly assisted and enhanced by members of the Grand Lodge of Victoria, Masonic Education team, led by V W Bro Dr Ruary Bucknell, who have discussed their programme and demonstrated the educational material they deliver to their new members. Interestingly, older members of the Craft in Victoria are now undertaking this education programme with great enjoyment.

As a result, your Masonic Education Team has developed a proposed Programme for Tasmania. It will consist of a mixture of the current Tasmanian Degree material and the Victorian Masonic Advancement Programme. The outline of this Programme has been considered by the Board of General Purposes and will be implemented in September. Three intrastate meetings will be arranged in the South, North and North West with Lodge Mentors to outline the Programme, their role and the long term future direction of the Tasmanian Masonic Education Programme.

While this development work was undertaken, parts of the proposed Programme have been trialled at well attended meetings at Lodge Scotch College and Poulett Lodge. Both meetings created considerable interest and discussion from all masons present.

Redevelopment of the Lindisfarne Motor Inn Property
Freemasons Homes has closed the Lindisfarne Motor Inn
and the property is now available for redevelopment for
the nursing home. Planning for extensions and
modifications are now well advanced by the architects.
The first application for overall planning approval to
proceed was lodged with the Clarence City Council at the
end of June 2013

The proposed work will consist of 3 parts: a new 38 bed wing of the nursing home, a new administration area directly off East Derwent Highway, and expansion of the community hub or gathering area where larger functions and activities can be held.

The Board intends to re-house residents from Bowditch Hostel in the new wing of 38 rooms to enable them to join their fellow residents at the Ballawinne Road facility. This relocation will see all the Bowditch Hostel residents move at the same time. There will be separate lounge and dining facilities as there are at Bowditch Hostel now, and all rooms will have garden views and be on the one level.

Plans for the proposed redevelopment are on display at both the Bowditch Hostel and the Ballawinne Road facility. It is hoped that work on the proposed redevelopment will commence around March/April 2014.

Re-accommodation of Bowditch Hostel residents will not happen before mid-2015 at the earliest. There are a number of options for the future of Bowditch Hostel which will be considered by the Board over the coming 12 months. However, first priority is being given to planning and completion of the new facility at the moment.

This is an exciting change in the life of Freemasons Homes, and has come about largely because of the opportunity to acquire the former Motor Inn. Additional information will continue to flow over the coming months as planning progresses.

It was a big ask of Xinyu who is a classically trained violinist and had no experience of playing Celtic music.

Fortunately, Xinyu embraced the project with enthusiasm, got on YouTube to listen to other players and wrote her own version. Xinyu's performance was warmly applauded by all present and her teachers at the Conservatorium of Music in Hobart, particularly Jun Yi Mah, Concert Master of the TSO, would have been proud of her.

Xinyu also played a traditional Chinese work, The Jasmine Flower, together with talented pipa (Chinese lute) player Zhou Fen. "Zhou Fen is like a second daughter to us, we have known her since she was a student at the University of Tasmania", said Greg. "I heard Fen and Xinyu play together at the New Year celebrations hosted by the Chinese Buddhist community in Hobart. They played together exquisitely after just one rehearsal and I knew I had to have them both play that piece at my installation banquet", he said.

Xinyu is a Master of Music graduate of the Conservatorium of Music. Fen is a Bachelor Education Honours graduate of UTAS and is also a graduate of the Conservatorium of Music in Tienjin, China. Xinyu subsequently played at the installation banquet of Worship Brother Douglas Deringer, Master of Lodge Scotch College.

Greg was installed in the Chair of King Solomon by the Most Worshipful Grand Master. Both John Wallace and the Deputy Grand Master, Right Worshipful Brother Alan Sangwell, accompanied by his wife Pam, attended the installation banquet which was held at the Launceston Club.

50 Year Jewel VWBro Bill Robinson

V Wor Bro Robinson was initiated on the 16th February 1963 into Empire Lodge No. 37TC, which was also his father's Lodge. He rose through the various offices becoming Worshipful Master in 1971/72. Bill took an active part in the Lodge taking on various offices including secretary for 6 years and becoming Worshipful Master again in 1999/2000.

He was elevated to Grand Lodge in 1982 serving in different offices and becoming Grand Director in 1986 and Grand Chaplain in 1988.

Bill resigned from Empire Lodge in 2001 and joined Daytime Lodge, playing an active part in that Lodge until its closure on 30th June 2012. He then joined Launceston-Lawrie Abra Memorial Lodge.

Bill also extended his Masonic career joining Ernest Clark Rose Croix in 1984 and rose to Most Wise Sovereign in 1995/96 and 1996/97. He was promoted to the 30th Degree in 1997 and became Grand Commander in 2006, elevated to the 31st degree in 2006 and the 32nd in 2010. He was awarded the Order of Merit in 2007 for services rendered.

Bill also extended his masonry outside the lodge room becoming Empire Lodge's representative in 1992 for the Masonic Homes and become a Director in 1994 and Treasurer in 1996. Only resigning from this office when he became a resident in 2004.

He had the honour of being made a "Member for Life" on the 17th October 2012. Bill has also been involved in the Peace Haven Chapel since 2001 and is currently the Chairman.

60 Year Bar - Rt W Bro William (Bill) Bannon

On March 21st, 2013 I had the great pleasure, on behalf of The Grand Master, to present a 60 year Bar to Rt W Bro Bill Bannon at his Mother Lodge, Roland.

The night was one of the wildest that we had experienced for a long time, electrical storms, extremely heavy rain and strong winds, but by the number who attended the meeting from across the North West Coast, Northern Area and West Coast, the Lodge was full, it showed the high esteem in which R W Bro Bannon was held, otherwise it was one of those nights you would have stayed at home.

Bill was initiated into Roland Lodge on January 10th, 1953; was passed on the 13th of March in the same year and raised on the 11th April, again in the same year, which in those times was very unusual, but behind the scene, the Lodge had an ulterior motive, they needed an Organist.

In October of the same year he took over the role as Organist, and apart from the years he was Junior Warden, Senior Warden and Master, he continued in the role, and is still, thank goodness, as these specialists are few and far between.

In 1962 he started his move to Master by assuming the Junior Warden's Chair, and in 1963 Senior Warden and in 1964, Master, then back to his role as Organist.

In 1958 he was approached by the then W Bro Elliston of Concord Lodge to play the organ at Concord, which he readily accepted, so he was now Organist at both lodges.

In 1976 Roland conferred Life Membership on Bill for his outstanding service. He affiliated finally with Concord in 1979, having been organist since 1958, and in 1980 Concord also conferred Life Membership on him, and in 1992 he became Master of Concord Lodge.

So, apart from 4 years whilst in Office, he has been Organist for both lodges as well as assisting in many other lodges and Grand Lodge, but still played at one when in office at the other.

In 1976 he had conferred on him the rank of Past Grand Standard Bearer, and in 1990 the rank of Past Deputy Grand Director, in 2009 he was raised to the position of Past Grand Warden.

In 1968 he joined Coronation Sovereign Chapter of the Antient and Accepted Scottish Rite for Australia, where he

received the 18th degree; worked thorough the various offices, and now holds the 31st degree; and unusual as it may seem, has also assisted with the organ in that order.

In 2003 Bill was presented with his 50 year Jewel, by Most Worshipful Bro Kearon, and I had the greatest of pleasure tonight, on behalf of Grand Lodge and all those in attendance to present the jewel to him with the 60 year bar attached.

At the Freemasons' Homes in Lindisfarne, residents in the Independent Living Units are getting ready to learn about the joys of accessing the internet using the latest technology.

A project with MacKillop College in Mornington will see students teach residents how to use IPads connected to the internet via Wi-Fi. A pair of students will visit each resident in their homes, every fortnight until the end of the year. A users' group will be formed and it is hoped the residents will support each other as they learn these new skills. The students will also compile a simple manual for the residents to use. The Aged Care Foundation of Freemasons' Homes will finance the infrastructure for this project and residents will buy the computers from Freemasons' Homes with a monthly or six monthly payment plan.

Because each student at MacKillop has an iPad, their skills are impressive and their willingness to share their knowledge with older members of the community is heartwarming. Initial visits, from MacKillop College computer staff, will include a group session with Independent Living Unit residents and subsequent visits will provide individual tuition for each resident or couple. The potential for friendships to develop is seen as a major benefit.

MacKillop College believes the benefits for their students will include a greater understanding of the ageing process, development of patience, improved communication, the ability to work as part of a team and enhanced writing and planning skills.

Some of the Independent Living Unit residents have never used a computer, while others are proficient users so there will be challenges for students and residents alike. Using Skype to chat to family and friends overseas, using a search engine to access the latest news or to find a recipe or just undertaking online banking are some of the delights in store for residents of Freemasons' Homes.

News from other Jurisdictions

Anniversaries Galore

2012 and 2013 have seen, or are about to see, a whole raft of Masonic anniversaries, including:

- The celebration of 275 years since Freemasonry was introduced into Germany from England. The first lodge established in Germany, Absalom to the Three Nettles, was consecrated in Hamburg on 6 December 1737. The celebrations, held in Hamburg in Sept and Oct 2012, included the world premiere of an orchestral piece written especially for the occasion: Masonic Symphony for Large Orchestra, Choir, and Soloists, by Gloria Bruni. On this occasion the 'large orchestra' was the Hamburg Symphony Orchestra.
- The centenary, in 2012, of the Grand Lodge of the Philippines. Although lodges working under other jurisdictions had been established in the late 19th and early 20th centuries, the Grand Lodge of the Philippines was not established until 1912. The event was marked by celebrations held in Manila in November 2012.
- The celebration, this year, of the 175th anniversary of the Grand Lodge of Arkansas. The anniversary is being recognized by an exhibition in the Historic Arkansas Museum entitled Treasures of Arkansas Freemasonry 1838 2013, that also features George Washington's family bible. By the way, did you know that Washington took his oath as President of the United States on a bible hastily brought from the nearby St John's Lodge No 1 when it was found that no bible had been provided for his inauguration.
- The celebration in 2013 by the Grand Lodge of Nova Scotia, of 275 years of Freemasonry in Canada. It is remarkable to find the Freemasonry was introduced into Canada in the same year that it was introduced into Germany.
- The centenary, in May 2013, of The Worshipful Society of Free Masons, Rough Masons, Wallers, Slaters, Paviors, Plaisterers, and Bricklayers (The Operatives).
- The centenary, in November 2013, of the Honorable Fraternity of Ancient Freemasons. Believe it or not, this is a women's Masonic fraternity founded in November 1913 at a ceremony held in Freemasons Hall, London. The Fraternity had its roots in Co-Freemasonry and was established by English Co-Masons who felt that the organisation was departing from traditional Masonic forms. The first Grand Master was Mrs. Elizabeth Boswell-Reid who held office from 1913 to 1933.
- The bicentenary, in December 2013, of the United Grand Lodge of England brought about by the union of the 'Ancients' and the 'Moderns' with HRH the Duke of Sussex (a son of King George III) as the first Grand Master.
- The centenary, in December 2013 of the establishment of the Grande Loge Nationale Française. Understandably, the French National Grand Lodge hopes to be back in amity before that date with those Grand Lodges that have temporarily withdrawn recognition, so that the centenary celebrations can be held in a true spirit of Masonic collegiality.

Did you know

The following are snippets from the Masonic Times.

That Freemasonry will be re-established in Egypt in 2013
with the consecration of Lodge Imhotep. The Lodge will work
under a foreign constitution until a Grand Lodge of Egypt is
established. Although Egyptian Freemasonry has a long
history, Freemasons have not been able to practice their craft
in recent decades because of the political climate.

- That Brother Radu Viasile 33°, Premier of Romania from April 1998 to December 1999, died on 3 July 2013 aged 71. He was formerly a Professor at the Academy of Economic Studies.
- That Freemasonry became legal in the United Arab Emirates on 28 February 2013.
- That Michael Baigent, co-author of Holy Blood, Holy Grail, died of a stroke on 22 June 2013. Michael was, from 1991, editor of Freemasonry Today and was a Past Grand Officer of the United Grand Lodge of England. He will be sadly missed

From the blog of Robert Cooper, Grand Librarian of the Grand Lodge of Scotland:

Adolph Eichmann's first job at the Gestapo was not to 'deal' with the Jews but rather to 'deal' with the Freemasons of Germany. That job was to create a card index system of all Freemasons in Germany. At that time the Gestapo section devoted to Freemasonry was larger than that for Jews. Many thousands of Freemasons were sent to the gas chamber. The figure of 80,000 is generally accepted as a conservative estimate for Europe.

What's Happening in France?

Brethren will know that the Grand Lodge of Tasmania, following the lead of the United Grand Lodge of England and the United Grand Lodge of New South Wales, has temporarily withdrawn recognition of the Grande Loge Nationale Française (GLNF). This action followed irregularity in the administration of the Grande Loge by the then Grand Master, Bro Francois Stifani, and his irregular action in gaining reappointment as Grand Master. The subsequent turmoil within the GLNF, leading to the formation of break-away groups, caused a number of Grand Lodges throughout the world to withdraw recognition until the situation in France had been regularised.

The French Government subsequently appointed a court official to administer the Grande Loge and conduct an election for a new Grand Master. As of 1 December 2012 the GLNF recovered self-government with a new Grand Master, Bro Jean-Pierre Servel, at the helm. Bro Servel was elected Grand Master after having gained an overwhelming majority of the votes in the election conducted by the court official.

On 24 June 2013, Bro. Servel wrote to all Grand Lodges advising that "the return to a state of calm and Masonic reality within the GLF is now a tangible reality" and emphasising that the brethren of the GLNF have "expressed their allegiance to the basic standards of traditional Freemasonry and more particularly their eagerness to apply scrupulously and unambiguously the basic principles of regularity prescribed by the GLNF's Mother Lodge, The United Grand Lodge of England".

Several of the Masonic jurisdictions that had withdrawn recognition, including the Grand Lodge of Washington and the Grand Orient of Brazil, have now re-established fraternal relations with the GLNF. The Grand Lodge of Tasmania will do so when the GLNF's Mother Lodge, The United Grand Lodge of England, is truly happy that the situation has stabilised and that the work of the GLNF is, indeed, regular. Let us all hope this can be achieved in time for the centennial celebrations.

Latest News from Masonic Homes of Northern Tasmania

Peace Haven

Masonic Peace Haven is a hive of activity as building works proceed on the redevelopment of stage 1 of our dementia-specific care area, the Balfour Unit, which is expected to be completed in November this year.

The second and third stages, comprising 32 places will be funded by a capital grant awarded in the 2012/2013 Aged Care Approvals Round just announced. This work will restore Peace Haven's 48 approved places for high care, and in particular dementia care which have been reduced significantly over the past 2 years due to a lack of demand for shared facilities, internal environmental considerations and competition. The grant will also allow the refurbishment of the Community Centre, Day Care areas and Administration as well as constructing a further 12 Low Care places.

An additional bonus from the grant is the approval of a further 16 High Care places, which will be funded by a Zero Real Interest Loan of \$2,903,000.

This most exciting news is a real fillip for our organisation as the current buildings have served the community well since 1986 but are now well and truly due for replacement in order to meet contemporary care needs and community expectations. The Board views these redevelopments as crucial to the future of Peace Haven as it means we will have modern facilities to help us compete in an increasingly consumer-driven and competitive aged care market and meet the challenges of the Living Longer: Living Better model for aged care now legislated for Australia. Financial modelling shows that income will improve through a more realistic mix of residents and appropriate staffing levels.

When all stages are complete, Peace Haven will have 104 places on site with no distinction between High and Low Care. The proposal to update the traditional Low Care area to introduce more flexible models of care and accommodation is still in the planning stages.

Fred French

Fred French Home is also gearing up for a major building redevelopment following resolution of the energy source and signing of a Deed of Agreement with the Australian Government.

The plans include building three new wings, as well as a total rebuild of the existing Robinson and Wilkinson Wings which are the main areas in need of a complete replacement, as well as the laundry, catering service and car parking.

In a spirit of brotherhood and co-operation, the Peace Haven Board willingly donated a small parcel of its own land on the southern boundary to the Fred French Home in order to allow the Home to rebuild the Robinson and Wilkinson Wings as planned. If this boundary adjustment had not been granted, it would have meant deletion of several new rooms from the development and a reduction in the numbers of available places with financial consequences.

Retirement Villages

The refurbishment and resale of independent living units in all Peace Haven's retirement villages continues to be a very real challenge due to the continuing depressed real estate market, the age of the dwellings, the increasing practice in the general community for persons to stay longer in their own homes, and the greater expectations of persons coming into retirement villages. Over the past three years, there has been a 45% turnover rate within the 4 villages operated by Peace Haven. The Board is currently reviewing its policies and strategies in relation to the units in order to meet the changing trends in this sector.

On Friday 14th June the newly built Community Centre for the residents of Docking Court and Flowers Court Retirement Villages was officially opened, with about 60 in attendance. This attractive, well-designed building has proved to be a huge success with the residents already and of great benefit to the social and communal life within the villages. Masonic Care Alliance

We are pleased to report that Masonic Homes of Northern Tasmania is now a member of the newly established alliance of care providers that operate not-for-profit organisations across all States and Territories of Australia, with tenets based in Freemasonry.

The Masonic Care Alliance was formed to address barriers being experienced in providing services and acknowledging that the system desperately needs reform. Following two years of planning, there was a unanimous decision in November 2012 to formally establish *Masonic Care Alliance Ltd.* The Board of MCAL comprises the Chief Executive Officers from the following organisations:

The Whiddon Group - NSW
Royal Freemasons - VIC
Star Gardens Residential - QLD
Masonic Care - WA
Masonic Homes Ltd – SA
Masonic Care – QLD, and
Masonic Homes of Northern Tasmania - Tas

Already, the Board has been represented in Senate debates on the Living Longer: Living Better legislation and meeting key players at Departmental and Government levels.

The next six months will be extremely busy ones for both Peace Haven and Fred French but the Boards, Administration and Staff are looking forward to being a part of this exciting redevelopment of our Homes which will help us meet the changing face of aged care into the future.

Derwent Valley Autumn


Wor Bro Peter Shacklady conducted an Information Booth at the Derwent Valley Autumn fair on 14th April 2013, which was well received by the local patrons.
