Speaking of the good works enacted in our name by the Board of Benevolence, on top of the direct help given to families or individuals, over the last quarter, we have provided immediate emergency relief to twenty-one separate clients of Cancer Council Tasmania, with amounts between \$200.00 ~ \$2,000.00 with a total donation value of \$15,350.00. Donations of \$10,000.00 to Hobart Legacy & \$10,000.00 to Launceston Legacy for the support of their respective Legatees were made and a further donation of \$10,000.00 to assist the Children's University Tasmania provide transport and catering for the children's Graduation Event's across the State.

The Board of Benevolence have also engaged a public relations company, FONT PR, to highlight to the State of Tasmania the good works already mentioned and we will be given the opportunity to work with FONT in also promoting the great works and benevolence our Lodges and Brethren do in their communities and I encourage all Lodges to identify and endorse a Public Relations Officer from your members, who can be called-on to supply the information you want to share, this can be just a picture and a paragraph of text emailed to them—don't forget, if you want this magazine you are currently reading to continue, please send (magazine@freemasonstasmania.org) your stories to share your events and news, it really helps the team out.

WELCOME TO GRAND VIEW

The Grand Lodge of Tasmania has introduced a new Membership Management Tool. The aim is to provide an easy to use system that will allow improved membership record keeping and greatly increase the level of communication between the Grand Lodge, Lodges and individual members.

The platform selected is Grand View. It has been developed by Freemasons for Freemasons and is used by 77 Jurisdictions, 8982 lodges and over 800,000 masons worldwide.

Currently the Grand Secretariat is transferring and purifying the membership data. Once that task is complete, a limited release to selected lodge secretaries for a trial period to work out any bugs will occur prior to February 2024. If successful, the system will be released to the remaining lodge secretaries.

Of course, all releases will include training in the use and operation of the system.

Toward the middle of 2024, the system will be available to individual members. Access will be based on your degree and role within your lodge. As an individual member, you will have access to your personal information and will be able to update it as necessary. Your lodge secretary will have access to all of your lodge members details and the Grand Secretariat will have access to all membership details.

Management of all of our membership records will now be from an intuitive web based interface. Information is updated in real time and the system promotes distributed data entry and management by allowing Lodge Secretaries to interact directly with the database.

Current and past contact information is stored in the database for contacting members as well as genealogy reporting.

The individual's information which is currently being verified and transferred are their dates of Initiation, Passing & Raising, Lodge/Grand Lodge Officer positions held and the history of their Masonic career and Member contact details.

Future additions will be online Member education, Member photos, online dues payment/donations and accounting.

There are an ever growing number of resources, most of which are currently available from our Freemasons Tasmania website. Once Grand View is available to all members, all of these resources will be held in Grand View and the secure section of the website will be closed.

Security and privacy are not an issue. All Grand View data is hosted and stored in their own data centres on their own database servers.

An interesting side measure that Grand View has identified is that of our current members, we have a total of 12 brethren who have been recognised by the nation with Australian Honours.

We have two holders of the Australia Medal (AM) and 10 holders of the Order of Australia Medal (OAM). Of note, that all of these gentlemen received their recognition for their efforts outside masonry, practicing those virtues we teach in the Craft. What better advertisement for Freemasonry.

To get the best out of the system, if you haven't already, we need you to register onto Grand View for two main reasons, to check your details are correct and secondly, so you receive emails directly to your inbox from Freemasons Tasmania. Then you will be able to access Exchange Notice's and other information and announcements when they become available, as you will be sent a notification email.

Instructions to register are as follows:

Step 1. Enter the URL: <https://tas.grandview.systems>

Step 2. Click on Member Portal (top banner)

Step 3. Click on Member Registration (top banner or you can click the "Sign up" next to forgot password)

Step 4. Enter your Lodge Number

Step 5. Enter your Member ID (ask your Lodge Secretary if you don't know it)

Step 6. Enter your Last Name - (case sensitive)

Step 7. Click on Check Membership Status

Step 8. Enter your email address.

Step 9. Enter a password that you can remember (password must contain at least 8 characters)

Step 10. Enter Confirmation by entering password again.

Step 11. Click on Submit

Due to the decline in members who use the facility and the ever increasing cost's to us all, 100% of the shares in the Freemasons Hall Company were transferred to Grand Lodge and since January 2018, the future options for 3 Sandy Bay Road have been under investigation by a team led by MWBro. Phil Oddie.

The team recognised that a substantial income stream was required to ensure the financial security of not only the building itself but also to support Freemasons Tasmania into the future.

Several options were considered, including retaining the status quo and relying on short term rental of the facilities, minor hospitality development within the building, joint venture development or outright sale of the property. The outright sale is not desirable, the short term rental or minor hospitality development did not provide an attractive income, which left the joint venture development.

The development of the site is not without its issues, as although not even 100 years old, the whole building, including internal architecture and fittings are heritage listed, so only a sympathetic development suspended above the building is an option.

Mr. Richard Crawford, who holds a Bachelor of Architecture from RMIT, a Fellow of the Royal Australian Institute of Architecture and is a Director of Architects Designhaus was engaged to provide designs and project manage the venture till the Development Application stage.

The concept of holiday apartment style accommodation and a roof bar built back from the road and to the level of the neighbouring buildings was chosen (images shown above). Our project, like so many others, lost momentum due to the pandemic lock-downs but is now back on track and reaching the final part of the application process.

This has been a long and at times frustrating project and we can only thank MWBro. Oddie for his guidance, sound judgement and patience in getting us to the application being lodged with the Hobart City Council.
